


Year 6 Learning Experience Overview

English

Maths

We will be covering objectives that
focus on:

Statistics and data, Shape (circles), Fractions,
Adding and subtracting fractions, Multiplying
and dividing fractions, Averages (mean) and
Algebra.

Computing

We will be using learncode.org to debug and sequence
programs. After, the children will be looking at the law
making process and using Scratch to design and write a
program to communicate their understanding of the
process.

History, PSHE and British Values

We will be focusing our work on the law making process, parliament and
government.

This has links to many British Values, including: democracy, the rule of
law and individual liberty.

We will also look at Acts that have been passed, including the
Education Act of the Victorian era.

During this experience we will be roleplaying the law making
process; making a bill, debating it in the House of Lords and
House of Commons as well as seeing whether the queen would pass
the bill as a law.
